



Sydney and New South Wales, Australia, Sands Street Index, 1861-1930



BRENNAN, Michael

Born 1844, Sydney, to Bourke by bullock-team. Around 1868 he bought Lot 5 of Sec. 4, West Bourke. He had married (06/01/1863) in Sydney, Sarah Ann Reed who was born in Sydney in 1847. In 1875 he is listed as a painter, Bourke. Had the "Native Dog" Hotel (q.v.) 1879-81. His address in January 1878 is Darling Street. He is still in town April 1882. There is a Brennan's Bend near North Bourke. A Richard Brennan died 24/11/1898 aged 31. Michael's daughter Isabella M.M. was born at West Bourke 15/03/1869, the grandmother of Mrs Colin Johnston and many others.

HOTELS & LICENSES by (W. J. Cameron)

"MOUNTAIN HOUSE" Hotel at the northern point of the northern hill at Mount Oxley. (The main road at the time ran past it), and the Shire road now. On 14/1/1873 James REED is granted a new license (2 sit. 3 bed.). Reed's original selections were taken up in 1869, so he may have had a shanty there earlier. They were transferred respectively to J.H. & A.G.O. Johnson in 1887.

Travellers began to "cut corners" on their route along the rivers, and wells were put down near the mountain and hotels established there at about a day's travelling distance for stock or wagons. The main road from Sydney now left the Bogan near the present "Greenvale" and went first to the "Mount Oxley" Hotel (on the edge of the "red ground" to the east), then to "The Mountain House" on the northern end of the smaller mountain. At one time, earlier it ran between two mountains.

Surveyor Campbell's map of 6th July, 1867 (No. G. 1989 R. Ref. 67/96) mentions "Gongolgon" Station, Mr. Joseph Why's Inn, wm. Neville, James Reed, the surname Gay, and a "Native Fishery on granite rocks".

The Week: - The Bourke correspondent of the Western Examiner, on the 28th ultimo writes: - A few days ago Mrs James Reed, of Mount Oxley, twenty miles from Bourke, showed me some butter made on the Yankee system. Three pints of cream was placed in a cloth and buried in the garden about two feet, but before the three days allowed, curiosity compelled them to see what it was like. I am using some of it now, and it is superior to the churned butter, being firmer and sweeter. I would advise all parties living in warm climates to adopt this plan.
