NEW BAYLEY COURT HOUSE.—The Sessions this quarter did not terminate till Wednesday evening in the second week. We would hope they have not occupied more than their usual time from the actual increase of crime, but from the prolonged attention which the respective cases may have required. The following are the sentences of the whole of the prisoners:—

To be transported 7 years.—Alice Wrigley, for stealing two pieces of calico from R. Say and Co; Elizabeth Ireland, for stealing five silver tea-spoons from Captain De Frank, at Hulme; and Thomas Taylor alias Elisha Major, for stealing a piece of hair-cord from Messrs. Gleave and Co.; Joseph, Henry, William and James Entwistle, for stealing shoes, &c. from James Bent, at Bolton; John Clement and John Thorp, for stealing gunpowder, &c. at Bolton; Peter Wright and John Dick, for stealing woollen cloth from J Scholfield, at Wardleworth; and James Slater, for stealing a sack from W. Staining and others, at Ashton.

Henry, Joseph, James and William Entwistle are all recorded in the Lancashire Criminal Register as being sentenced to 7 years transportation for larceny at the January 1813 Session of the Assizes.
