BREWARRINA.

October 6.

Since my last communication, we have had a few smart showers—sufficient to freshen the grass, after our late heavy rains mentioned in last report. The river is now fordable, eight heavy laden waggons having crossed to day, besides several other teams that crossed last week, conveying the clips of Messrs. J. and J. Doyle, of Morrabillah, and Messrs. Lord and M'Niver. Beemey have finished shearing, as also Charlton, and from what I can learn the clips surpass any of previous seasons. Brewarrina Police Court, September 30th, 1871. Before James Govan and Harris Cohen, J.P., **Henry Johnson** was brought before the court, on warrant, charged with stealing a saddle and bridle of the value of £6, the property of **Henry Coppard**, of Milroy Station. The case was conducted by senior-constable M'Elligott, in a very able manner. From the evidence of the prosecutor, it appeared that prisoner was shearing at the Milroy shed, and one evening decamped, taking with him the saddle and bridle in question, which were both identified by Coppard as his property. The prisoner upon receiving the usual caution by the Bench, replied that he had nothing to say. He was committed to take his trial at the next **Bourke** Quarter Sessions. It transpires that the prisoner **Johnson** is a connection of the bush-ranger of the same name, and great praise is due to the police on bringing this young worthy so speedily to justice. Before James Govan, Harris Cohen, and John Kennedy Doyle, J.P. The same prisoner stands charge with stealing a horse, the property of Robert Elliott, of Milroy Station. The evidence for prosecution was to the effect that the prisoner had been working at the Milroy woolshed, and stole the horse in question. He was arrested at Gongolgen, and remanded to Brewarrina, for the production of witnesses. He at first denied having any horse, but upon being arrested by the police and being shown a horse in their possession, he owned the animal and acknowledged having stolen it. The decision of the bench was the same as in the former case.

In the Small Debts Court, on Monday, Alex. Ramsay v. **Henry Johnson**, £8 16s., for labour and materials. In this case there was a vast amount of words, and, as the bench said, some very hard swearing. It appeared that the plaintiff had done some work on a cottage belonging to defendant, but it transpired that a third party had engaged the plaintiff, with the understanding that the bill was to be deducted from the rent. Case dismissed.—**Johnson** v. Ramsay, £5 12s. 6d., board and lodging. Verdict for plaintiff, £4 12s. 6d.—**Robinson** v. D. Solomon,

DISTRICT COURT.—This court was opened before his Honor Judge Josephson, on Tuesday, 8th instant. Mackay v. Roberts, verdict for plaintiff, £13 10s and costs. Lunn v. Divine, debt acknowledged. Several cases were settled out of court. This closed the civil business.

QUARTER SESSIONS.—This court was opened before the chairman, Judge Josephson, on Wednesday, 9th instant. Mr Docker prosecuted for the Crown. Three jurymen were fined £2 each. George Watt pleaded guilty to obtaining money under false pretences. W. Hopkins was found guilty of a similar crime. Henry Johnson was found guilty of stealing a saddle, and on a second charge of stealing a horse. Thomas Wells was found guilty of stealing money. On Thursday, the court opened at 9 a.m., and one juror was fined £2. James Seymour, charged with stealing a cart and harness, was found guilty, though he defended himself with vigour. Michael Griffith, charged with house-breaking, was acquitted. Wilson, alias Frazer, on bail, did not appear when called on, and a warrant was issued for his apprehension. On Friday, 1th, Joseph [Gilbert] was found guilty of receiving stolen money. James Brown, charged with wounding and cutting, was acquitted. The prisoners were then severally sentenced. George Watts, six months' in Bourke gaol. W. Hopkins, two years' in Darlinghurst. H. Johnson, twelve months' in Darlinghurst. The same, for horse stealing, two years in Darlinghurst: sentences not concurrent. Thomas Wells, two years' hard labour in Darlinghurst. James Seymour, received a similar sentence. Joseph Gilbert, twelve months' in Bathurst gaol. In closing the court, the chairman commented in strong terms on the conduct of Lurin, the publican, who prosecuted in the case of Watts.

The plan for the new journal is now within a short distance of Bourke, and it is anticipated the paper will appear shortly. The proprietors have canvassed a large extent of country, and have met with great success. I was informed the other day, by a gentleman, upon whom I can rely, that the list of subscribers is equal to the majority of country papers, and that the journal will be a credit to the town and district. On the first Wednesday of the coming year, Bourke will own a journal of her own.

The weather is very warm, and bush fires are raging on the Bogan and Warrego Rivers. No stock moving.

On Sunday last Mr. Henry Johnson, of the Mount Oxley Hotel, took up a loaded gun with the intention of firing at a hawk. The moment the trigger had been pulled the barrel burst, and very much injured the index finger of the left hand. Mr. Johnson was brought in by the mail coach, and Dr. Browne speedily dressed his wound. After the accident the lock of the gun was found seventy yards from where the shot had been fired, part of the barrel had been driven through the iron into the bar, and the barrel that was not burst was found on the top of the house.

The " Grim Reaper " has taken away another of our old and respected residents in the person of Mrs **Eliza Johnson**, who passed away on Saturday last. Mrs **Johnson** was born in 1841 at Wollongong, and would have been 84 years of age next month. Deceased had been a resident of the **Bourke** District since early in the Sixties. Her husband predeceased her 14 years. She enjoyed the best of health up till about ten days ago, when all the family were summoned to her bedside, one daughter (Mrs Wall) coming the long distance of 800 miles by car, arriving just in time to see the last of her mother.

The deceased had a family of four daughters (two of whom have died) and six sons. The surviving children are :—Mrs E. Jones, Mrs Steve Wall (Winton), and Messrs Albert, James, Samuel, Alexander, George and Benjamin. Deceased had 16 great grand children and 25 grand children.
