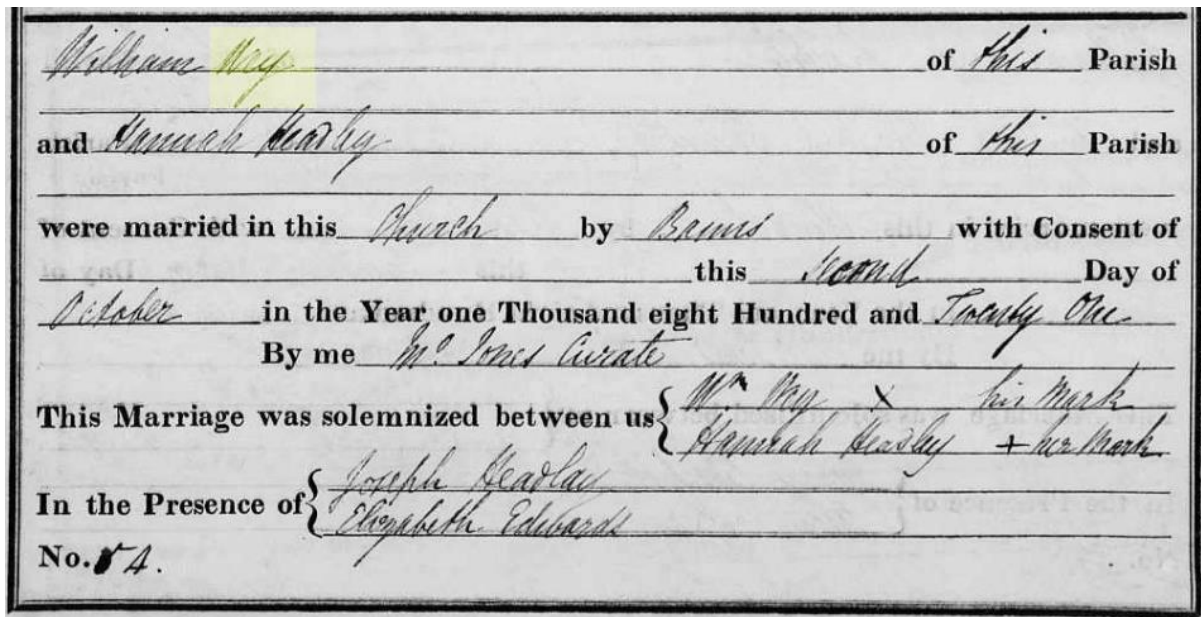

She had a son by George Haylock – Alfred Haylock Whye born 19/11/1852. Arrived in Qld aboard Zoroaster on 25/9/1874. To Sydney aboard “City of Brisbane” 4 Jan 1875.

He m Ann Denson in Christchurch NZ on 26 Mar 1885. Record says: In the home of Rev E Best, Worcester Street Groom's father 'unknown', mother: Jane Dogget Wye; witnesses Arthur Denson and Annie Roberts.

They had a son William Alfred Wye 1886 in Christchurch. Then Edward Arthur 1887 Bathurst; Florence Jane 1889 Bathurst; Sydney Denson 13/10/1891 Penrith; Hilda M 1896 St Mary’s. Son William Alfred died at Mt Victoria 29.1.1906. Wife died 21.8.1934 Badgery’s Ck. He died 22.10.1939 at Yetambah Station, Nyngan. Bu Nyngan. His son Sydney Dennison Wye died at Nyngan in 1974.

Family Whye 1821 William Hannah Hedlin

He is the most likely father of Alfred Ernest Whye (1882-1969), the Boer War veteran. He travelled to NZ in 1903 and remained there his whole life.

He could have journeyed from Sydney to Gongolgon at some time between 1875 and 1885 and could, therefore, be the father of Alfred Ernest Whye, born to an Aboriginal mother at Brewarrina in 1882. His son Alfred could be the Alfred Why who held the license of the Commercial (Lame Horse) Hotel at Gongolgon in 1899 – 1900 (just before he joined up for the Boer War). This Alfred would have been Joseph Whye’s grandnephew, son of his nephew Alfred Haylock Wye. (It is also possible that this licensee was Joseph’s nephew, but he was in the St Mary’s to Badgery’s Creek area at that time and had no real connection to James Murphy and Prudence Reed (who owned the pub at Gongolgon).

Albert Carr—Albert Why

SYDNEY, Tuesday.

A strange case of "ringing-in" was revealed at last night's meeting of the New South Wales Rugby League, when Albert Why, known as Albert Carr, of the South Sydney Rugby League team, who recently returned from England, asked for permission to play with South Sydney.

Carr was one of the most prominent players in this State, and when his name was announced to last night's meeting of the New South Wales Rugby League as Why many of the delegates were mystified. He was granted permission to play with South Sydney, and in future he will be known on the football fields of this State as A. Why.

In conversation, Why said he had commenced his football career at Wellington in 1917. In 1921 he was at Redfern Oval, when he was asked to play as A. Carr with the Mascot third grade team. Why candidly admitted that he had taken the place of another player, and was what is known in the turf world as a "ring-in."

Then selected as "Carr," he played with Newtown for a year, and, after a period in the City Houses' Association, he joined the South Sydney team. During this time and after he went to England he maintained the name of Carr. Now he wished to play under his proper name. He has a brother, J. Why, in the South Sydney team. Both are exceptionally fine players.

The Rugby League did not inquire into the reason of his changing his name. One official said cases of "ringing-in" were frequent in the ranks of some of the junior clubs.

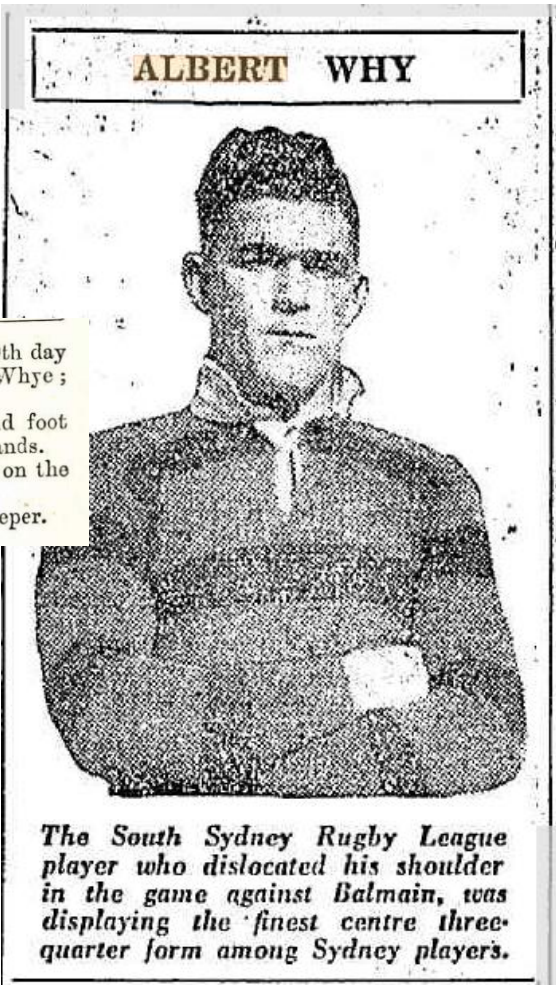
